

Meeting of the Board

July 1, 1921

The meeting of the Board was held July 1, 1921/ Present, Miss Pritchard, Mrs. Corbett, Mrs. Johnson, and Mrs. Whiteside. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The treasurer reported a balance on June 1 of \$1461.92, and since then received as follows: \$150.00 from the City, \$24.50 dues, \$12.00 dues, \$6.00 in subscriptions, amounting to \$339.42. The June bill came to \$599.74, leaving July 1 a balance of \$1054.68.

The report of Chairman of Finance Committee was read and approved, showing that in January \$881.00 were received, in February, \$581.00, in March \$422.00, in April \$266.00, making Total of receipts up to date, \$2,150.

Directors report covering a review of the entire winter's work was read and approved, telling of Americanization work accomplished, work in infant welfare, dental work, and that accomplished in Albina. We now have 21 milk stations in various schools under City Health Board, 8 home nursing classes, and dental clinics conducted under the Junior Red Cross. The infant welfare work growing; a well baby exhibit for one week conducted in May at Meier & Frank's Auditorium. Mrs. Rockey was largely responsible for its success.

Our night school in Albina was very successful, closing with a membership of 70. We plan picnics and outings for the Serbians etc. during the summer, as a means of keeping in touch. Mrs. Davis has made 228 calls, as the Social Service visitors, and a number of interesting cases were cited with the help we are giving in helping to work out the various problems that contribute to illness and poverty.

The Dispensary reports a goitre clinic recently started by Dr. Else. In March we had the heaviest month ever known at the Dispensary, with 874 patients treated. The X ray is now installed and paid for. In

May the statistical report showed a total of 807 patients treated, an average of 56 per day, with 1396 visits made.

Dr. Dillihunt expects when the medical school opens in the fall at least 40 students a day at the Dispensary. He hopes for larger quarters, and talks of the possibility of securing the entire building, combining our work with other branches of health work.

The meeting was adjourned till the autumn.
