

Minutes of the Annual Meeting
of the
Peoples Institute and Portland Free Dispensary
February 1928

The regular Annual Meeting of the Peoples Institute and Portland Free Dispensary was held in the office of the Dispensary on Friday morning, February 3, 1928 at 10:00 o'clock.

Those present were Mrs Rockey, presiding, Mrs Chaney, Mrs Honeyman, Mrs Gerlinger, Mrs Grelle and Miss Prichard.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Mrs Gerlinger reported that she and Mrs Corbett had gone in November to consult with Mr Lonergan about the money which the Boxing Commission receives from the Boxing Matches, which according to the law must be used for Charity. At that time Mr Lonergan reported that he thought he could give the Institute about \$1500.00 about the first of the year, but up to this time we have heard nothing from him.

It was decided that Mrs Rockey and Mrs Gerlinger should call upon Mr Lonergan next week.

It was moved seconded and carried that this fund, if acquired should be used for the services of a special Social Service Visitor which we have long needed.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted. It showed :

Miss Prichard gave a review of the year's work, mentioning the growth and development of the medical and obstetrical clinics, the installment of the fine X-ray equipment by the medical School and the gift of the two sun lamps and the interesting work that is being done with them.

Mrs Corbett's appointment of Mrs Rockey and Mrs Gerlinger on the Joint Dispensary Committee was approved by the Directors.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
