Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Kerr and Miss Prichard were appointed a committee to formulate a letter to send out in an attempt to collect the money out standing on the Albert readings. Miss Prichard reported that the Dispensary fee per patient had been raised from 10¢ to 25¢ and that the patients had paid the 25¢ quite as readily as they had the 10¢ and that the fees the past month had been \$52. as compared with \$21. the previous month.

The plan of the membership campaign, as suggested by the Community Chest, was discussed. It was moved and seconded that the membership campaign be postponed until we find out whether the Community Chest expects to function again next year.
